Proverbs Conclusion; March 3, 2025 - Men's Monday Morning Bible Study

Intro & Review:

Proverbs are not promises but short pithy statements about how the world God made normally works. Written primarily by Solomon (with contributions from Agur and Lemuel), Proverbs contains 915 verses across 31 chapters in most English translations (e.g., NIV, ESV, LSB), blending poetic parallelism with concise, memorable insights. These proverbs reflect observations about human behavior, divine order, and the consequences of actions, typically expressed in a two-line structure contrasting wisdom with folly or righteousness with wickedness.

Themes and frequency: 915 verses total

I have listed eight themes in the book of proverbs:

- 1)The fear of the LORD (18x).
- 2) Wisdom (~100x) tied for 2nd
- 3) Women (~160x) 1st place but could be divided into subcategories
- 4) Righteousness and wickedness (>100x) tied for 2nd
- 5) The fool (~80x) and scoffer (14x) 3rd
- 6) The mouth, tongue, speech (~70x) 4th
- 7) Discipline and parenting (~50x) 5th
- 8) Work ethic (~40-50x) 6th
- **1.** The fear of the LORD (TFOTL) -18 verses directly: 1:7, 1:29, 2:5, 3:7, 8:13, 9:10, 10:27, 14:2, 14:26, 14:27, 15:16, 15:33, 16:6, 19:23, 22:4, 23:17, 24:21, 31:30.
- **2. Wisdom**: For precision, focusing on **explicit mentions** of "wisdom" or "wise," the count lands around **120-150 verses**. This aligns with:
 - Strong's Concordance data (~90-100 uses of *chokhmah* and *chakham* combined).

Thematic density in Proverbs' 915 verses, where wisdom is a keyword in ~13-16% of the text.

3. Women:

Personified Wisdom/Folly: ~60-65 verses (chapters 1-9).

Adulteress/Seductress: ~60 verses (chapters 2-7, 22-23, 30).

Wives: ~8-10 verses (chapters 10-31).

Mothers: ~10 verses (throughout).

Virtuous Woman: ~22 verses (chapter 31).

Total Distinct Verses: Adding these, we get 160-170 verses. Some overlap exists (e.g., 7:4-5 mentions both Wisdom and the adulteress), but most are distinct.

4. Righteous vs wicked

Approximately **100 to 120 proverbs** in the Book of Proverbs (LSB) relate to the mouth, speech, or tongue, based on direct references and thematic implications. This is about 11–13% of the book's 915 verses. For a precise count, a verse-by-verse tally would be needed, but this range reflects the text's strong emphasis on wise communication

5. The fool and scoffer

Fool: In Proverbs, "fool" translates several Hebrew words:

- *Kesiyl* (Strong's H3684): A dull, stubborn fool, appearing most frequently (~49 times in Proverbs).
- 'Eviyl (Strong's H191): A perverse or morally deficient fool (~19 times).
- Nabal (Strong's H5036): A vile, senseless fool (~3 times).
- Derivatives like "foolish" (sakal, H5530, or related) also appear.

Total: Scholarly concordances (e.g., Strong's via Blue Letter Bible) tally around **70-75 mentions** of "fool" or "fools" and another **5-10** for "foolish," summing to approximately **80 mentions** of fool-related terms. This varies slightly by translation (e.g., NIV might use "foolish" more than ESV). **Scoffers**: Translates *luts* (Strong's H3887), meaning a mocker or scorner, often paired

with fools but distinct in its connotation of derision. **Frequency**: *Luts* (scoffer) appears **14 times** in Proverbs, per Strong's (e.g., 1:22, 9:7-8, 13:1, 14:6, 15:12, 19:25, 19:29, 20:1, 21:11, 21:24, 22:10, 24:9, 29:8). "Scoffers" (plural) adds a few instances within these.

6. The mouth, tongue, speech

7. Discipline or parenting

- "Son" (ben) appears ~70 times, but only ~25-30 are in direct parenting contexts (e.g., "my son").
- "Father" ('ab) appears ~50 times, with ~20-25 tied to parenting (often with "mother," 'em, ~10 times).
- "Discipline" (musar) appears ~30 times, but only ~10 are parental (others are God's discipline or general).
- Scholarly Insight: Commentaries (e.g., *Proverbs* by Waltke) note parenting as a key theme, especially in chapters 1-7's father-son discourses and 10-31's proverbs, estimating 5-10% of the book (~45-90 verses). My count leans conservative.
- Adjustment: Excluding vague references (e.g., 11:16 on women unless parenting-specific), 45-55 holds.

Approximately 50 verses in Proverbs deal with parenting explicitly—covering instruction (~25), discipline (~10), outcomes (~12), and legacy (~3-5). This is ~5-6% of the 915 verses, fitting Proverbs' focus on familial wisdom transmission. For precision, a concordance could refine it (e.g., BibleGateway), but 50 is a solid estimate

8. Work ethic

Defining "Work Ethic" in Proverbs

• Explicit Mentions: Verses using words like "work" ('asah, Strong's H6213, or ma'aseh, H4639), "labor" ('amal, H5999), "diligent" (charuts, H2742), or "hand" (as in effort, yad, H3027).

Estimating the Frequency

• Explicit Terms:

- o "Diligent" (charuts) appears ~10 times (e.g., 10:4, 12:24, 13:4).
- "Sluggard" ('atsel) appears ~14 times (e.g., 6:6, 13:4, 20:4).
- "Work" or "labor" ('asah, 'amal) appears ~10-15 times in work-related contexts (e.g., 12:11, 14:23).

- "Hand" (effort) adds a few more (e.g., 10:4, 12:24).
- **Verses Involved**: Many of these terms appear in couplets contrasting diligence with laziness, so a single verse might use multiple terms (e.g., 10:4). Counting distinct verses:
 - Chapters 6-9 (anti-sloth ant passage, 6:6-11) contribute ~5-10 verses.
 - o Chapters 10-31 (proverbs proper) feature work ethic in ~30-40 verses, often paired with outcomes (e.g., 10:4-5, 12:11-27, 13:4, 14:23).
- **Total Estimate**: Scholarly analyses (e.g., *The Book of Proverbs* by Bruce Waltke) suggest ~40-50 verses explicitly mention diligence, labor, or the sluggard. Adding implicit references (e.g., planning in 21:5, skill in 22:29), the count rises slightly.
